Closing Performance: Saturday, August 2 at 8:00 p.m.
 A powerful culmination of the intensive, this performance premieres original works developed by faculty and students alike.

- Vincent Gros (France/Spain) Ballet Master of Ballet de Catalunya, celebrated for his depth of classical technique and contemporary versatility.

- Kevin O'Day (USA/Germany) Internationally sought-after choreographer with over 80 ballets for companies such as New York City Ballet and Les Grands Ballets Canadiens.
- Raffaele Irace (Italy/Germany) Director of Gallus Theater in Frankfurt Germany and Solocoreografico Festival, brings deep experience from Forsythe's legacy and European contemporary scenes.
- Karen Boyd Bethel (USA) A former Radio City Rockette and musical theatre choreographer, infusing storytelling and technique across genres.
- Ayinde Hurrey (USA) Performer, educator, and founder of Hurrey-UP Performing Arts, presenting rich West African dance and drumming traditions.
- Austin Hartel (USA/Paraguay) OIDF's Artistic Director and former Pilobolus dancer, whose global career blends physicality, theatricality, and community.

Free Community Days for Young Dancers

OIDF will host free Community Day classes for youth dancers (ages 9-15) at Oklahoma Contemporary on:

- Saturday, July 26
- Saturday, August 2

These full-day sessions (10:30 a.m. to 3:45 p.m.) include classes in Ballet, Jazz, Modern, and African Dance. Pre-registration is encouraged. Dancers should bring lunch, water, and appropriate attire.

Dancers emerge from the experience with not only enhanced technique, but a deeper understanding of their creative voice and place within the global dance ecosystem.
